Leopard Gecko

Latin Name Eublepharis macularius

Native to Pakistan/India

Maximum Length 8–9 inches

Life Span 10–18 years

Enclosure Use screen top terrarium only.

• 20 gallon terrarium for single gecko

• 30–40 gallon for multiple young geckos or paired adult females

(Separate males at 10 months old.)

Provide multiple hiding spots, such as mopani wood, half-log, or clay cave, and

climbing branches/rocks.

Substrate reptile carpet (EcoCarpet), cypress mulch (Forest Floor) for young geckos

VitaSand, RetpiSand, or ground walnut shell (Zilla Desert Blend) for adults only

Flat stones placed over fine sand provide variety.

Temperature day 78–85°F, basking 90°F, night 70–72°F

infrared heat lamp, ceramic heat emitter

Light crepuscular/nocturnal

UVA fluorescent lamp (NaturSun) and basking lamp for 12–14 hours daily

Humidity dry, less than 40%

When shedding, mist inside one shelter to create a humid zone.

Water Provide water in a small shallow dish.

Food insectivorous

Use crickets with calcium/multivitamin supplement. Feed young geckos every 2–3 days, adults every 4–7 days. May sometimes offer adult geckos mealworms or waxworms.

Shed Cycle every 2–4 weeks

Sexing Maturity reached at around 18 months (7–8 inches long, including tail).

male: pronounced femoral pores in V-shaped row and two bulges near anus

female: smooth pores, absent or less pronounced bulges.

Maintenance Remove waste and food debris. Sift sand or spot clean carpet.

Rinse water dish and replace water.

Feed insects.
