

Pacman Frog

Latin Name	Ceratophrys ornata
Native to	South America
Maximum Size	4–6 inches
Life Span	6–10 years
Enclosure	Use screen-glass top combo terrarium or screen top with removable cover panels to maintain humidity. <ul style="list-style-type: none">• 5–10 gallon for young frog (keep single)• 10 gallon for larger frog Provide shelter such as a half-log, plants, or mopani wood.
Substrate	coconut fiber (EcoEarth) by itself or with living moss (Frog Moss)
Temperature	day 75–85°F, night 68–78°F infrared heat lamp, heating pad
Light	diurnal Ambient light or incandescent/LED lighting for viewing, 10–12 hours daily.
Humidity	tropical, 70–90% Use a fogger or mist with distilled water daily. Keep substrate moist.
Water	Provide purified water in a bowl.
Food	insectivorous/carnivorous Feed every 1–2 days: crickets dusted with calcium/multivitamin supplement May sometimes offer mealworms, caterpillars, or small mouse.
Shed Cycle	every 1–2 weeks Frog will eat skin as it sheds, usually at night.
Sexing	male: likely to have dark throat or chirp a mating call, but not certain
Maintenance	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Remove waste and uneaten crickets.▪ Rinse water bowl, replace water.▪ Feed crickets or pinkie/fuzzy mouse.▪ Mist plants and substrate.
